# Edmund Burke Academy AP United States History: Summer Assignment

Welcome to Advanced Placement U.S. History (APUSH)! Below you will find the summer assignments, all of which are designed to introduce you to a variety of skills and sources you will need to master during this course. While it may seem a bit overwhelming at first, you are being given two weeks to complete what is usually due in just a few days. My suggestion to you is to "front-load" your work...in other words, start right away while instructions are still fresh in your mind. Don't procrastinate! Remember, should you choose to do so...well, there's a grade for that. Assignments are due at certain times because that is when the material will be discussed. - Complete the *Native American Cultures* taba chart (attached).
- Complete Questions (*AP Exam Review Period 1*, Answer questions on a separate sheet of paper; write both questions and answers in blue/ black pen)
- Study the handout entitled, The Columbian Exchange, and be prepared to discuss it in class.

- Read, *Cabeza de Vaca Among the Indians*, p. 4 (text). Answer the questions at the beginning of the reading (handwritten, blue/black pen)
- Read Las Casas,' *Of the Island of Hispaniola* (attached). Answer the questions at the bottom of the reading (handwritten, blue/black pen)
- Read Columbus,' *Letter to Luis de Sant' Angel* (attached). Answer the questions at the bottom of the reading (handwritten, blue/black pen)
- Complete Venn Diagram comparing and contrasting European and Native American culture/views (attached).

#### **Guidelines:**

- Explain your understanding of the "American spirit," and explore the unique condition of being an "American."
- You may use **brief quotes** from your text (or other appropriate sources) to support and illustrate key points.
- **Document** your information from the books/websites [MLA format, example: (Goldfield 88) or ("Webpage article title") or (Webpage author's last name).]
- Paper should be well-organized, 1½ -2 pages, typed in 12 pt. Times New Roman font, with a **Works Cited page** (see my webpage for a copy of the format).
- This is not your unsupported opinion...develop a position, provide evidence for 3 good points, document it, then defend it. If you can defend it, I'll accept it...honestly, I will...
- \*\* NEVER submit papers to me in folders, binders, etc. Simply staple, before class starts...and submit. I require hard copies to be submitted in class. Only in emergencies or with **prior approval** will I accept an email attachment.
